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The beginning

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What is the culture?

Culture in general is concerned with **beliefs** and **values** on the basis of which people interpret **experiences** and **behave**, **individually** and in **groups**. Broadly and simply put, "culture" refers to a group or community with which you share common experiences that shape the way you understand the world.

Stereotypes

A stereotype is commonly held popular belief about specific social groups or types of individuals. Stereotypes are standardized and simplified conceptions of groups based on some prior assumptions.

Most interesting findings (1)

- First of all, the purpose of this partnership was to develop, implement, and evaluate an interactive VLHE course to our group, second, during to this course we were able to test ourselves and learn how to communicate remotely.

- Raise a smile by the fact, that we all became almost friends, but never had eye contact with each other.
- Some of us spoke and wrote English wrongly same way

Cultural Modules in VLHE course (generalization)
